



# TRAPPED IN HURRICANE IRMA

### Congregation members survive massive Hurricane whilst on holiday

Neil and Margaret Calder have been regular visitors to Florida for many years and love the weather out in the Sunshine State. Here they tell their story of when the weather turned and how they survived being caught up in one of the largest Hurricanes in recorded history.

We survived, THANK GOD, we feel truly blessed. When we arrived last weekend it was to the news that Hurricane Irma was definitely going to hit Florida.

Now us being hardened Scots and used to wind and rain thought 50 mile winds, even 80 miles winds....we have seen this before.....what a mistake!! The eye of the storm was 40 miles wide and the hurricane over all was over 300 miles wide. The noise was like a couple of freight trains coming towards us at once from all directions gusting, they say, to 110 miles but it felt like it was much more.

The height of the storm passing over us lasted for 18 long hours. Our friends Jill, Doug, Bob, 'Lucky' the dog (who slept through the worst of it) together with Neil and I took refuge in a 'safe room' 6' x 8'. Mostly without any power and a little wind up radio (thank you Trevor Baylis)

which kept us in touch with what was happening.

We opted for Jill's condo, because of the expected 15 foot water surges for our area, as it is on the second floor. While we had power and TV we saw, to our horror, that the water at Fort Myers beach, the Caloosahatchee River and all the canals were being sucked out at an incredible rate and knew that we truly were in trouble. By some miracle the hurricane instead of passing on the west of us moved and passed on the east dumping more rain on us than forecasted and lessened the surge, savings thousands of lives and homes.

Returning to Bob's home to check it out and finally Neil and I checking out the community we are staying at. Sadly that community did not fair as well and we have been unable to gain access because of the height of the flood water. Hopefully we can get access in the next couple of days.

There are some upsetting and sad sights but neighbours, friends and complete strangers are all out helping each other. Thankfully we are safe and amazingly the power was restored early this morning ..... and the sun is shining. Neil has been out with Bob, in the community, helping where they can and I have been left in charge of food! Thank you to all our family, friends and neighbours for all

their messages of love and prayers. We love and appreciate you all. xx
