POLICE REPORT

PC Kierran Cameron said that 11 incidents had been reported. These generated 5 crimes as follows: 2 Road Traffic Offences, 2 Fraud Offences and 1 Theft.

CYCLE TRACK

Patrick said that **Colin Young** had attended a meeting about the cycle track and a nature study is being carried out at the moment.

MATTERS ARISING

Church Hall Patrick said that the parts of the grounds that were being used as "drinking" areas

Road Drains: Patrick said that the drain outside the Geilston Hall has been cleared, but after it has rained,

water flows down the A814 and past the drain. It pools at the bottom of Darleith Road. This is a real danger when it turns to ice in winter. **Councillor Kennedy** said that he will report the

matter to the appropriate officer.

Brian Watts said that the road at **Ardoch** suffered quite badly during the recent heavy rain.

The road drainage is not coping.

Remembrance Patrick said that the parade was cancelled due to the pouring rain. The service was held

CORRESPONDENCE

Duncan said that he had received an email from Network Rail about work being carried out at the level crossing next to the station. The crossing will be closed from 0600 hrs on Saturday 27 December 2025 until 2200 hrs on Wednesday 31 December 2025.

PLANNING

- 1. Alteration to the front elevation and erection of raised decking to a property in Kilmahew Avenue.
- 2. Alterations and an extension at Keppoch Lodge.
- 3. Construction of 3 agricultural sheds at Cairniedrouth Farm.
- 4. Change of use from an occupied dwelling to a holiday let accommodation at Geilston House.

None of these were deemed to be of concern to the Community Council.
