MODERATORS VISIT

The Rt. Rev. Dr Russell Barr, Moderator of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland, made a week -long visit to Dumbarton Presbytery at the end of March.

Based in Dumbarton he travelled to all areas of the Presbytery, reaching out to different organisations, both church based and otherwise. He met with many folk - from the young, at Douglas Academy, and the Tullochan Trust to those of more senior years at a Bearsden group called 'Too Many Candles'– from the fit and healthy at Dumbarton Football Club where he brought luck to the home team - to those in hospital and hospice care, at Vale of Leven, St Margaret's Hospice and Robyn House. He also visited Low Moss Prison, The Maid of the Loch, the Submarine Base at Faslane and the Peace Camp.

On the two Sundays of his visit there were special united services at Alexandria, Clydebank and Milngavie culminating with a quite wonderful and uplifting Songs of Praise in Helensburgh Parish Church on the final evening of his visit. At that service Dr Barr and his wife, Margaret, received gifts commemorating their very busy week and he warmly thanked everyone, throughout the Presbytery, for arranging such an interesting and welcoming visit.
