I wonder if you saw the news coverage concerning Leonardo Da Vinci's painting entitled Salvator Mundi? Dated to around 1500 Da Vinci depicts Christ wearing Renaissance dress with his right hand raised in blessing and his left hand holding a crystal orb signalling his role as Saviour of the World.

The painting is thought to have belonged to Henrietta, wife of Charles the 1st before it became lost in the chaos of turbulent times. It came to light at an auction in 1958

when it was sold for £45.00 - obviously considered not to have been painted by Da Vinci's own hand. But last month it sold at auction as an authentic work for 341 MILION POUNDS! This makes it the most expensive painting ever sold at auction and from what I can gather it has been bought for a private collection.

This means that whoever had such a vast amount of 'spare change' to purchase the painting will at best enjoy it in private and at worst have it stored in a vault where it will never see the light of day... (cont P3)




