

TREASURER'S REPORT

The object of the exercise, as far as the Treasurer is concerned, is to balance the books.

We started 2020 with a healthy "Reserve Fund" though we knew this would be depleted with the loss of income in the sum of £6000 from the Playgroup who had moved to the school.

In early Spring we had a problem with the heating system in the Halls. This meant replacing the pipework, radiators and boiler, all as approved by the Church Of Scotland Heating Engineer. We had funds available from the sale of the former Manse to meet this cost along with generous Grants from the General Trustees of the Church of Scotland.

It therefore came as a body blow, when on 23 March, as a result of Coronavirus that we had to close the Church and the Halls, with a huge loss of income from Worshippers and Hall Users.

We had to take serious measures, or our "Reserves" would have been exhausted by the end of July. Accordingly we set up a Giving Campaign which received an enormous response from willing and generous supporters of the Church, and which realised the colossal sum of £22,000. A huge Thank You to one and all

This, together with continued support of those who contribute direct through the Bank and through WFO Envelopes, has achieved sufficient funds to see us through till the end of the year, meeting all our commitments to the National Church, Insurance, Gas, Electricity, salaries etc.

Meantime we had committed to further Stonework at the front Gable of the Church, but the cost £14,000 has been met equally by Grants of £7000 each from The National Churches Trust and Miss Hendry's Trust, to whom we are eternally grateful.

The Finance Committee will meet shortly to prepare a Budget for next year, but already we can foresee difficulties ahead. With a limited number of people attending Church due to the Coronavirus restrictions and with the lack of Christmas and Spring Fairs and the further shortage of Hall users, the Treasurer cannot see his way to balancing the books in 2021, bearing in mind that our commitment to Mission and Aid to the Church of Scotland will be in the order of £45,000.

We have been unable to welcome back many of our regular groups because of the restrictions but we can now have Claire's Dance class. Further, we are delighted to receive additional income from The Scottish Children's Reporter Administration who are making good use of our halls - a lifesaver at this time.

Let's hope the Treasurer doesn't have many more sleepless nights. Answers please on a postcard!

KIRK SESSION TRIBUTE: MICHAEL WILSON

Where do I begin? Whatever I say could never be enough to do justice to Michael's life because his was a life worthy of more than a few words. His was a life full of adventure, opportunity, courage, faith, hope and love. His was a life well lived, fulfilling and fulfilled. In his own words printed on his funeral order of service, "I have enjoyed the happiest of the world. I have lived and loved."

Michael reached the age of 92 but in many ways he still saw the world through the eyes of a child – always waiting for something good to happen, always seeing the best in people and always trusting that God would bring some blessing which he could share with others. And I have to say he was never disappointed. Even in spite of illness and infirmity he approached each day with a joy that many of us will never have.

Michael's face just radiated God's love. I read somewhere recently that the gifts of grace and prayer are for believers. GRACE – unmerited favour with God. PRAYER – the privilege of communing with God. Combine the two and you get the blessing of communing with the Holy One. That sums up Michael. He received Jesus by faith and was assured of heaven. His walk with God was so close that God's love shone through him and was a blessing to all of

He was a man of strong character but gentle in manner; a man who stood on his principles but did so with grace; a man who wasn't afraid to speak the truth but did so in love.

How blessed and privileged we have been to have Michael as a friend, to serve with him on the Kirk Session and to be on the receiving end of the wonderful stories of his successful and adventurous life. In the words of the old

saying, "you could write a book about it" - well Michael did just that! His memoirs were completed recently and the printed version had just been delivered to High Auchensail a few days before he died. The book is entitled, "Dios es mi co piloto" – "God is my co-pilot".

Or as his son Richard said at the funeral perhaps it should have been "God is

my pilot". The reason for this is that Michael placed his complete trust in his God and never wavered in that trust.

The sadness of losing Michael is overwhelmed by the sense of thanksgiving for a soul returning to his creator. Michael blessed us with his presence while he walked among us and brought all of us a little nearer to God. Now he walks with God in eternity.

We continue to pray for Rosemary. They were devoted to one another and cared for each other so lovingly. They made a great team and together they supported not only our church but also St. Michaels and countless charities at home and abroad with fundraising events at their home. We pray also for their sons, Crispin, Andrew, Richard and Alistair and their wives and children. Michael has left them a legacy of love and big boots to fill.

His blessing to them was included in the service and I'm sure it was meant for us all:

Peace be in thy home and in thy heart, Or, if thou roam earth's highways wide The lord be at thy side to bless and guide.

"Thank you", Michael. May God bless you now you have completed your journey through earth's highways and find rest in the house of your Lord for eyer.

Our last service of worship was March 15th just before Lockdown and I have left the numbers of the hymns we sang that day on the hymn board as a reminder. I long for the day they can be changed because that will be the day we can sing again.

The previous week to that sad day we had a joyous time together when Steven Fischbacher of Fischy Music came and taught us new songs. Church Families from Cardross, Helensburgh and Dumbarton came along to the church hall and we all had a wonderful time of fellowship singing our hearts out. This is a good and positive memory of what life was like before COVID and it gives us hope that one day we shall be able to rejoice again in the presence of others.

But in the meantime, we have to adapt and work within the parameters set by those in authority who seek to guide us through these difficult times. The restrictions may seem harsh but they are necessary for our safety. Many of the activities and groups that normally take place in the hall have not been able to resume but this does not mean that church life ceases completely. The buildings may have been shut but the Church as God's people was still open. All through this period we have functioned as a church and will continue to do so:

Every member received a personal card to let them know they were upheld in prayer and elders have been keeping in touch with their districts. The Prayer Group faithfully remember the sick and the bereaved.

People receive flowers when bereaved and cards when in hospital because visits are not allowed.

Worship went online and will continue even though Sunday Worship in church has resumed.

DVD's are delivered to those who have no access to computers.

Every child associated with the church through Sunday School, Holiday Club, Messy Church, Music Makers or the Dunny Cafe received a personal card and sweets in the summer.

A virtual Holiday Club was produced with five days of crafts and stories and songs.

The Primary 7's received their Scripture Union "It's Your Move Books" when they started secondary school.

The Kirk Session and Congregational Board met and attended to all the business of the church. The Presbytery and the General Assembly met.

From all of this and more you will see that we are endeavouring to be make sure that the spiritual and practical needs of our congregation, local community and wider community are met. We seek to be Church in the widest sense of the word and to bring the love of Jesus to others in these challenging times.

Christmas will be different for all of us. That is the stark reality. Some will be on their own. Some will be grieving. But even though Christmas will be different the message never changes. Jesus Christ was born in Bethlehem, the Word made flesh, Emmanuel - GOD WITH US! So we need never feel alone or afraid. The Light came into the world and the darkness has never been able to put it out.
